Measure ____ allows the City Council to control its own calendar. The City Charter requires that the Council shall hold regular meetings "at least twice each month." This change would remove the words "at least twice each month." When the City Council operated as both the Council and the Redevelopment Agency, it met four times a month – twice as Council and twice as the Redevelopment Agency. With the dissolution of redevelopment, the Council only regularly meets twice a month. This charter change gives the Council flexibility in setting the number of meeting dates. As an example, the City normally does not hold Council meetings on the night before the municipal elections nor on national holidays. While the Council has priority on use of the Council Chambers, it can become a significant inconvenience to other organizations that use the Council Chambers such as the School District or City commissions when they get bumped from their normal meeting dates. Although it is the City Council's intent to meet twice each month whenever possible, the Council should have flexibility to set the number of meetings during any given month.
